His unwavering dedication to the field of Park and Grounds Maintenance has helped establish the City of Troy Parks and Recreation Department as one of the premier park systems in the State of Michigan.

As Park Supervisor for sixteen years, Mark has had the responsibility of leading his crew in park and public grounds as well as tree maintenance for the City's urban forest. Mark is a state-certified trainer in the field of Pesticide Application and conducts regular training sessions for park personnel.

Mark brought irrigation to the athletic fields and was instrumental in converting the irrigations systems to computerized MAXICOM control to more accurately deliver the appropriate amount of water to each field, resulting in resource savings for the City.

Colombo has been on the forefront of the Emerald Ash Borer invasion and has coordinated removal of municipal ash since 2002.

# Clyde Herb Oakland County Parks and Recreation



Clyde Herb has worked for Oakland County Parks and Recreation (OCPR) for thirty-three years. As OCPR Chief of Park Operations, Clyde Herb has made outstanding contributions to park maintenance and park operations through programs, systems, and attentiveness to facility functions.

He assisted with the redesign and development of the Groveland Oaks campground and created a maintenance procedure for the park's waterslide. Clyde Herb works closely with the County Sheriff's Office to coordinate deputy patrol schedules at the parks. He has also revamped the camper registration system.

Clyde Herb's forethought and organizational skills have been a strong contributing factor in the enhancement of Oakland County Parks and Recreation.
