

Recreation Leadership Award

Carla Vaughan
City of Troy



An MRPA member for 34 years, Carla has shown outstanding contributions and leadership in the area of senior and adaptive programming. A modest professional, she only looks at what more she can research, create, and offer. With her staff and 249 volunteers, she serves a population in Troy of 80,000 plus. Carla's dedication to programming for the community is truly remarkable. Estimates from old budgets project the senior budget before Carla began was \$27,880. Today, more than 105,000 seniors participate in a variety of programs, generating over \$275,000 in revenue. In 1978 Carla's job expanded to include adaptive programming, which today serves 166 individuals. Not afraid to tackle a difficult task, Carla has initiated numerous programs and services. Her innovative ideas have led to the creation of Adopt-Our-Senior-Center, Friendship Club, and SeniorNet Learning Center. This is just a small sampling of the successes brought to Troy by Carla. She has obtained numerous grants to fund senior and adaptive ventures, including the Community Foundation of Troy Grant in 2003 and 2007, Detroit Lions, Dominos, Generations Online, HAP and SeniorNet National Grants. Due to Carla's diligence, Troy's Senior Center was awarded the National Council on Aging/ National Institute of Senior Center accreditation. Over 20 partnerships have been forged with agencies to provide additional services. Carla has dedicated herself to serving populations that most put limits on, but she puts no limits on what anyone is or what they can do.

As a 35-year member of MRPA, Mickey has been instrumental in developing and growing programs at the state and local levels. He has been a member of the MRPA board for nearly 20 years as the Special Projects Chair, overseeing the Amusement Park ticket program. This program has generated nearly \$2 million for MRPA and \$500,000 in commissions to local agencies statewide. Mickey was one of the founding members of MESRA (Michigan Employee Service and Recreation Association) in 1982 serving offices of President, Secretary, and Treasurer in Michigan as well as being a national board member for NESRA. He has been dynamic in his roles at Southfield Parks and Recreation (12 years) and Clawson Parks and Recreation (23 years). He was responsible for establishing a Community Center in Clawson—a place for residents of all ages to congregate. His dedication and commitment to the local parks and recreation departments as well as his involvement with MRPA continues to make a difference in the lives of people in Michigan! With a BS in Recreation Leadership from Wayne State University and a Masters degree in Recreation and Park Administration from Central Michigan University, Mickey continues to have a passion for the parks and recreation industry. When you talk about creating community, Mickey has done that from the small town of Clawson, to the larger city of Southfield, to the entire state of Michigan, to the national stage!
