

## *Park Resource Leadership*

**Mike Wilhite**  
**Oakland County Parks and Recreation**



Mike Wilhite's ingenuity and mechanical talents amazed and assisted his co-workers at Oakland County Parks. Mike invented an attachment for existing equipment to construct boardwalks over wetlands. It minimized impact on the wetlands by resting on completed sections and "reaching out" to install one support helical pier at a time. On one project alone, his invention saved \$23,000. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality was so impressed with the sensitive nature of the process, it granted Oakland County Parks permission to work in wetlands during the typical restriction period of April 1-July 1. Mike also invented a "large scale gadget" accommodating four huge spools to pull wire into conduit for group camping areas. His invention enabled staff to wire the areas in about half the time. He also served as a mentor and trainer, instructing staff to operate aerial equipment, chippers, stumpers, chainsaws and heavy equipment. Mike created the annual "Groundskeeper Olympics" to keep seasonal staff focused on using equipment safely and correctly. He developed an Equipment Maintenance Program that will be rolled out to the entire 13-park system. Mike was a gentle man with sharp, mechanical mind, knowledgeable about so many things. He was never without a smile, and always willing to help or answer a question. Mike passed away September 9, 2009 at the age of 53. He was an Auto Mechanic II with the Facilities Operations and Maintenance Unit for 22 years.

## *Grand Award*

**Rebecca Humphries**  
**Department of Natural Resources**



Rebecca A. Humphries was named director of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources April 19, 2004, leaving the DNR's Wildlife Division where she had served as chief since December 1998. Humphries is responsible for the administration and direction of the department, which has 1,400 employees and a \$290 million budget that supports programs for wildlife and fisheries management, state parks and recreation areas, conservation and law enforcement, forest management, state lands and minerals, and communications.

Humphries is a graduate of Michigan State University, with a degree in fisheries and wildlife, and has completed course work toward her MBA through the University of Wisconsin. She was awarded an honorary Ph.D. in public service from Central Michigan University in December 2004.

Mike Devlin has displayed Recreation Leadership for Meridian Township and MRPA for over ten years.
